

Subject: European REACH Regulations (EC 1907/2006), plus UK implementation statues, and amendments in respect of ECHA SVHC levels in articles and materials supplied by Pall.

General Information on SVHCs:

In relation to the European REACH candidate list of substances listed for 'Authorization', and those substances on the 'Authorized' lists currently issued by ECHA (herein referred to as SVHCs), and based on current knowledge of the materials of construction of Pall products, we can state the following:

- We do not anticipate any of the current REACH listed SVHCs to be present at a concentration of greater than 0.1% (w/w) in most 'articles' produced by Pall*. However, where they are present above this concentration in the article, we will communicate the presence of the applicable candidate listed or authorized, or 'component article' if the finished product is a 'complex object', as required by REACH to our customers in the European Economic Area (EEA) and United Kingdom (UK). Plus, Pall will also make applicable entries to the European SCIP database.
- For substances and mixtures, EU format safety data information will include any candidate listed or authorized SVHC if above 0.1%, or Pall product safety data sheets if subject to specific additional Annex XVII limits, or where the article is considered hazardous.

This activity is subject to regular review in relation to any changes to the above, including review of further SVHCs as they are added to the Candidate lists.

General Information on REACH Registration:

The REACH regulation (EC) number 1907/2006 stands for Registration, Evaluation, Authorization, and Restriction of Chemicals.

The REACH regulations potentially affect all European companies in the EEA - whether they are substance manufactures or importers, formulators of chemical mixtures, article manufacturers, or downstream users. In addition, the UK has implemented these requirements into UK statute. While directly applicable to Europe and the UK, it also impacts companies outside of Europe wishing to supply their products into the EEA - or where they are a supplier to a company wishing to do so.

From January 5th2021, Pall has registered those Articles and Complex Objects it places on the market in Europe, where an SVHC concentration is known to be present above 0.1% and therefore requires identification in the ECHA SCIP database. In line with the requirements of Waste Framework Directive 2008/98/EC Article 9(1)(i) as amended by 2018/851/EU.

*Although Pall Corporation is primarily a manufacturer of 'articles'. We directly import some substances into the EEA requiring REACH registration by an appropriate Pall entity.
